

Tetragon is a closed-ended investment company that invests in a broad range of assets, including public and private equities and credit (including distressed securities and structured credit), convertible bonds, real estate, venture capital, infrastructure, bank loans and TFG Asset Management, a diversified alternative asset management business. Where appropriate, through TFG Asset Management, Tetragon seeks to own all, or a portion, of asset management companies with which it invests in order to enhance the returns achieved on its capital. Tetragon's investment objective is to generate distributable income and capital appreciation. It aims to provide stable returns to investors across various credit, equity, interest rate, inflation and real estate cycles.

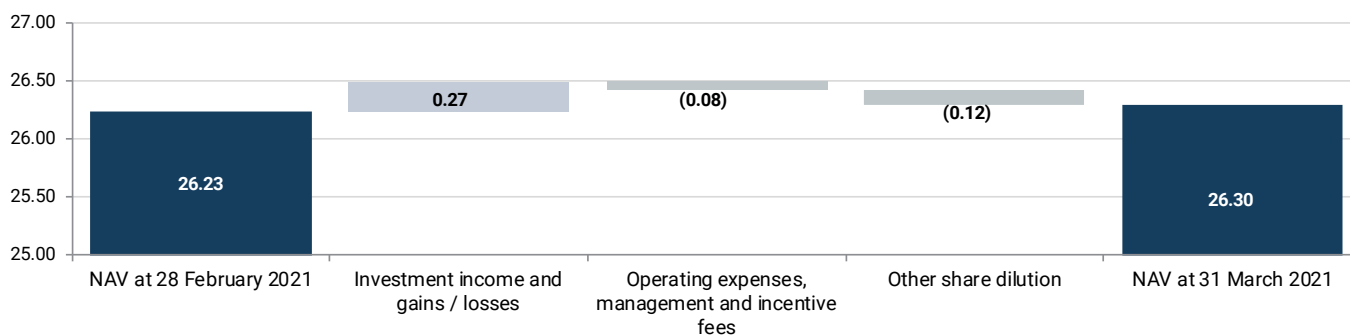

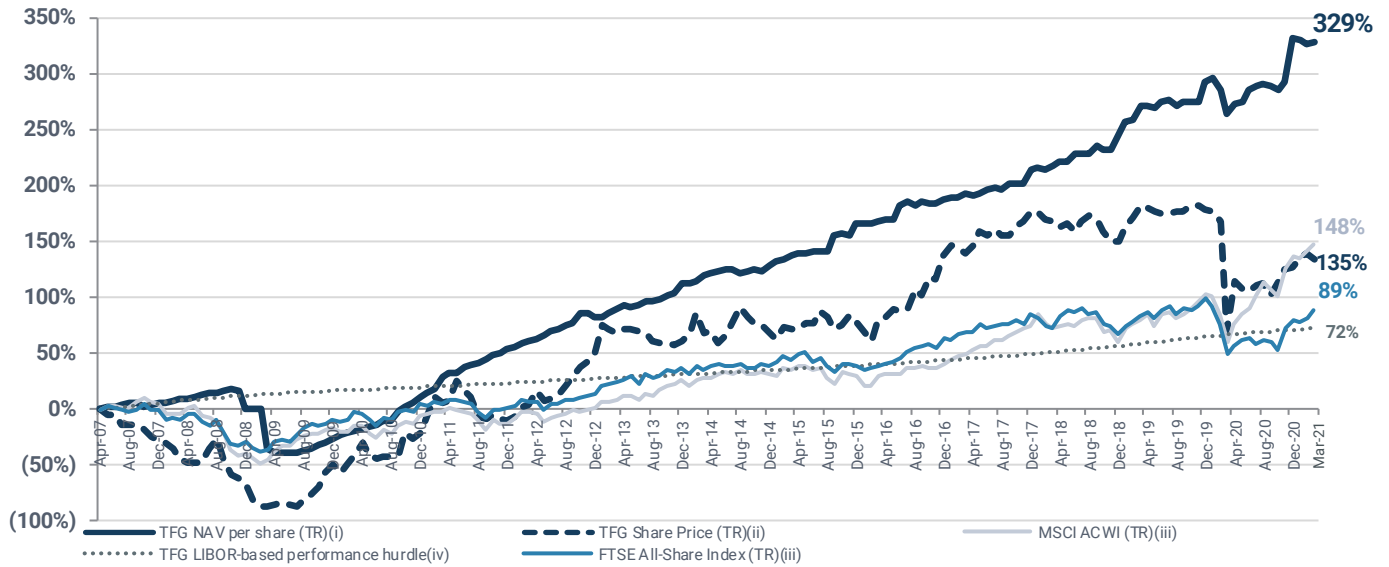
(iii) Assets characterised as "other equities & credit" consist of investment assets held directly on the balance sheet. For certain contracts for difference (CFD), gross value or required margin is used. Under IFRS, these CFDs are held at fair value which is the unrealised gain or loss at the reporting date. Payments and receipts on the same investment have been netted off against each other.

(iv) Net cash consists of: (1) cash held directly by Tetragon, (2) excess margin held by brokers associated with assets held directly by Tetragon, and (3) cash held in certain designated accounts related to Tetragon's investments, some of which may only be used for designated purposes without incurring significant tax and transfer costs, and (4) adjusted for all other assets and liabilities at the reporting date including any drawn amounts on the revolving credit facility.

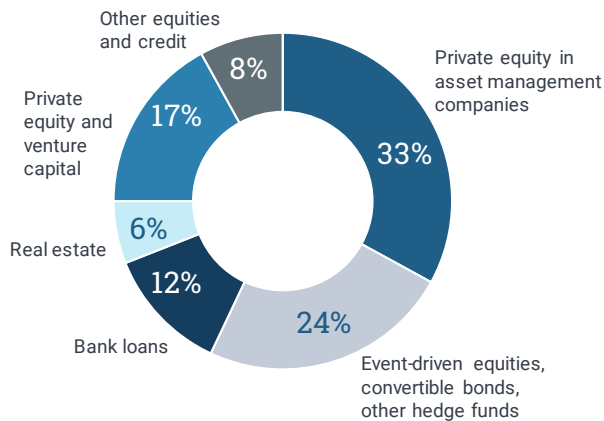
## First Quarter 2021 Review

- ◆ **Tetragon's NAV:** NAV decreased by \$4.5 million during the first quarter, driven by net income of +\$2.1 million and net dividends of -\$6.4 million. The net income comprises +\$18.8 million of investment income and gains, -\$15.6 million of operating expenses and management fees, and -\$1.1 million of interest expense.
- ◆ **Largest performance drivers:** Positive contributions primarily came from: (1) private equity and venture capital, other funds and co-investments (+\$13.4 million) in the category, due to positive revaluations of certain portfolio companies and (2) investments in U.S. CLOs managed by LCM (+\$13.2 million) against a backdrop of improving loan credit fundamentals, historically low liability financing costs in the U.S. bank loan market, and positive revaluations due to a recalibration of certain cashflow modelling assumptions. Bank loans as an asset class (including Tetragon's investments in funds managed by Tetragon Credit Partners) were overall the strongest contributor in the portfolio during the quarter. Primary detractors during the quarter were (1) the investment in Hawke's Point Fund 1 (-\$23.5 million), driven by softness in the gold mining sector associated with a decline in the gold price; and (2) the investment in Equitix in the private equity in asset management companies category (-\$14.1 million), due to the impact of the increase in the expected future UK corporate tax rate on the discounted cash flow model.
- ◆ **Additions, disposals, and receipts:** Tetragon made additional investments of \$90.4 million, including \$20.0 million into the Polygon Global Equities Fund, \$16.2 million into other equities, and \$15.6 million into U.S. CLOs managed by LCM; and had disposals and receipts of \$79.1 million during the quarter which included \$50.3 million from disposals in 'other equities'. Bank loans generated cash of \$16.6 million.
- ◆ **TFG Asset Management:** AUM for TFG Asset Management was \$30.7 billion at 31 March 2021.<sup>(6)</sup> Headcount was approximately 410 at the end of the quarter (excluding BentallGreenOak).
- ◆ **Dividend:** As set forth in a separate Tetragon announcement, the Board of Directors declared a dividend of \$0.10 per share in respect of the first quarter of 2021.
- ◆ **Other:** LCM closed a \$403.2 million collateralized loan obligation (CLO), LCM 31, in February.

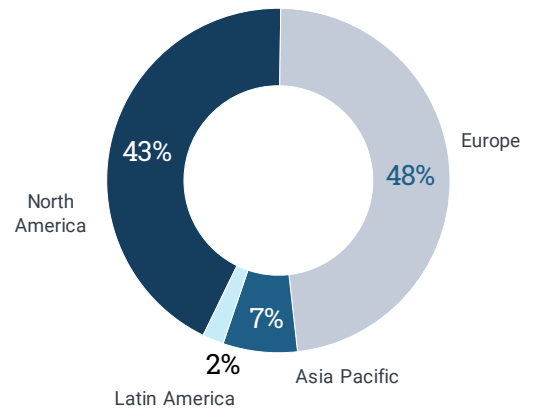
## NAV Per Share Total Return and Share Price Total Return Since IPO<sup>(7)</sup>

- Tetragon seeks to deliver 10-15% Return on Equity (RoE) per annum to shareholders. Tetragon's returns will most likely fluctuate with LIBOR. LIBOR directly flows through some of Tetragon's investments and, as it can be seen as the risk-free short-term rate, it should affect all of Tetragon's investments. In high-LIBOR environments, Tetragon should achieve higher sustainable returns; in low-LIBOR environments, Tetragon should achieve lower sustainable returns. In the current environment characterised by continued and sustained low risk-free interest rates, reduced sustainable returns across Tetragon's investments, including outside of Tetragon's target return rate, are to be expected. The "Annual Average Since IPO" figure includes the current year.
- The dividend yield represents the last four quarterly dividends divided by the TFG NA share price at the date of this Monthly Factsheet. The 5-year Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) figure is at 31 March 2021. Each of the foregoing includes in its calculation the latest declared dividend.
